Parcs de Noe - Newsletter August 2020

Parc de Noé has created its own window into the virtual world via www.parcsdenoe.org! Although still under development, this gives a major boost to the visibility of Parcs de Noé, and more is still to come. On the ground in the Protected Areas, protection and community support activities continued in Niger and have fully resumed in Chad despite the COVID-19 restrictions still in place

Main results

Niger / Termit and Tin-Toumma

- A total of 300 man-days of anti-poaching patrols have been executed in coordination with the Departmental and Regional Directorates of the Environment Ministry as well as 150 man-days of community surveillance
- Annual monitoring of the management of the Reserve was ensured by a delegation of the Environment Ministry
- · Five new students (3 girls, 2 boys) from the Reserve started schooling in
- the Zinder boarding school supported by Parcs de Noé · Ecological monitoring of the basins of the Termit massif revealed that all
- currently contain water, indicator of high level of rainfall · Six double cabin pick-up vehicles have been ordered

Chad / Binder-Lere

- Resumption of aerial overflights made it possible to locate the elephant herd in the Reserve
- Launch of the recruitment of a law enforcement expert to train guards and
- coordinate patrols Orders have been placed for field equipment to reinforce law enforcement capacity

Management & Infrastructure

- Drilling of a well for the HQ of the Reserve in progress
- Six (6) double cabin pick-up vehicles have been ordered
- Tender for the construction of the Reserve HQ published Contract signed for the renovation of the Tesker base
- Order placed for communications and surveillance equipment to be delivered and installed in August and September (solar drone, radios, V-SAT, camera traps, etc.)

Law enforcement

- 4 anti-poaching patrols, or 300 man-days of patrols executed, including 3 by the Regional Environment Directorate and the Tesker and Tânout Departmental Directorates.
- · Provision of IT and office equipment, as well as logistical means for the Department of Wildlife, Hunting and Protected Areas and the Regional and Departmental Directorates of Tânout and Tesker (computers, 10 250CC motorcycles, furniture)

National Park creation

- The file on the creation of the National Park, based on the national legal framework, was finalized and validated by the Environment Ministry
- The public consultation process for the creation of the National Park was defined by the ministerial team. The process will take one month and it will be initiated in September

Law enforcement

- The recruitment of an Anti-Poaching Expert was initiated with the publication of the job offer and the receipt of the first applications • A first part of the ordered field equipment was received at the headquarters in
- The purchase of more individual surveillance equipment continued with 2
- identified suppliers

Biodiversity conservation

- Aerial surveillance resumed this month with 20 hours of overflight covering 2,970 km. This permitted to locate:
- The elephant herd and a sable antelope in the northern part of the Reserve as well as 4 Kordofan giraffes in the southern forest.
- 52 herds of cattle and 29 nomadic camps inside the Reserve, mainly in its northern part
- 20 camera traps were received at headquarters and will be sent to Chad to be deployed in the field to better understand the wildlife composition of the Reserve

Congo / Conkouati-Douli

 Regular contacts have taken place with the Ministry of Forest Economy regarding the draft Partnership Agreement submitted last June
