

This month Parcs de Noé has grown once more with the **recruitment** of a communication manager at headquarters, an anti-poaching expert for Chad, and 2 community surveillance agents in Niger. Despite COVID-19 restrictions, activities have progressed in the field. In Niger, addax groups have been located around and in the Termit and Tin-Toumma Reserve, while in Chad **public consultations** were launched for the conversion of the heart of the Binder-Léré Reserve into a National Park, and in Congo exchanges with the government accelerated to move forward on the

management agreement for the Conkouati-Douli National Park.

Infrastructures are progressing in the Termit and Tin-Toumma Reserve with the completion of a **new borehole** (150m deep) that provide water for the headquarters.



As every year, 5 pupils (3 girls, 2 boys) from the Termit and Tin-Toumma Reserve received a scholarship to attend

### TERMIT TIN-TOUMMA RESERVE

### MANAGEMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE

- Granting of an "Accord de Siège" to Noé by the Government of Niger which will facilitate operations (importing goods, visa) for the Termit and Tin-Toumma Nature Reserve.
- To supply the Reserve's Headquartes with water, a borehole with a depth of 150 m was successfully drilled.
- A contractor was selected for the construction of the headquarters, which is due to start in early November for a period of 4 months. • Renovation of the **Tesker base** is underway and will be completed by
- mid-October.
- The satellite internet connection has been installed at the Tesker base.

### LAW ENFORCEMENT

· 2 anti-poaching patrols

- were conducted, i.e. 170 man-days of patrols, including one dedicated to addax monitoring in collaboration with the Tesker and N'Gourti departmental directorates and the General Directorate of Water and
- Forests. Location of 3 addax poached 3 to 4 months ago, 2 adults and 1 juvenile, in Tin-Toumma, probably by a vehicle coming from Libya.

### **BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION**

• Ecological monitoring of addax has allowed to identify at least 3 groups of addax representing 30 to 40 individuals in areas where pastures are abundant after the rainy season.

### COMMUNITIES & SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

- 150 man-days of patrols to support security, intelligence and public
- Recruitment of 2 new Community Agents • A sustainable pastoralism plan for the reserve is being drawn up and

## BINDER-LÉRÉ WILDLIFE RESERVE

### CREATION OF THE NATIONAL PARK

- The public consultation phase for the creation of the National Park was officially launched on September 14, during a workshop in Pala
- organised by the Ministerial team. • In addition to the kick-off workshop in Pala, local workshops were organised in the 4 Cantons concerned by the National Park, namely Léré, Binder, Lagon and Gouin. More than 300 people participated in
- these workshops and 6 local commissions were set up. Press releases and spots have also been broadcast on national television and 3 community radio stations, and will be maintained for
- the duration of the public consultation. • A consensus was reached on the name of the National Park, proposed by the local communities of the 4 cantons. The future park will be called "Zah-Soo", the Moudang name attributed to the Gauthiot Falls, which means "place of purification".

- The recruitment of an anti-poaching expert was finalised following individual interviews with the 5 qualified candidates. The appointment is scheduled to take place between the end of October and early
- The order for **individual surveillance equipment** for the field agents in charge of protecting the Reserve has been finalised and is currently being prepared by the supplier.

# **BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION**

• The aerial surveillance programme of the Reserve continued this month with 20 hours of overflight covering 3,036 km. This aerial patrolling made it possible to locate the herd of elephants in the northern part of the Reserve close to the border with Cameroon, as well as 43 herds of cattle, 26 nomadic camps and a fishing camp set up at Gauthiot Falls in the heart of the protected area.





### **FOCUS ON AN ENDANGERED SPECIES**

The Kordofan Giraffe, West and Central African giraffe or Sudanese giraffe (Giraffa camelopardalis antiquorum) is a subspecies of the northern giraffe and is found in western Sudan, northern Cameroon,

southern Chad in CAR and DRC. The name Kordofan comes from an ancient province of Sudan. Its population fell by 85% between 1985 and 2015. Classified as critically endangered by the IUCN, at the beginning of 2018 only about 1,400 individuals remain in the wild.

The Binder Léré wildlife reserve is home to around ten individuals.
